The Code of Virginia provides that each county be governed by a board of supervisors, which is elected by qualified voters. The Board of Supervisors of Albemarle County is comprised of six members from each magisterial district. Supervisors are elected to four-year terms, which are staggered at two-year intervals. The election of supervisors is held as a part of the State general election in November of odd numbered years.

What You Need to Know Before Moving

Airport - The Charlottesville/Albemarle Airport Authority operates the local airport (CHO)

Natural Gas Service- Natural gas service for urban Albemarle County is provided by Charlottesville Gas 434-970-3211

Electrical Service- Electrical service for most of the county is provided by Dominion Virginia Power (866) 366-4357

Phone Service- Telephone service for the majority of Albemarle County is provided by Century Link (866) 904-1817

Landfill/Recycling- The Rivanna Solid Waste authority operates the landfill and recycling services (434) 977-2976

Library- Public library services in Albemarle County are provided by the Jefferson- Madison Regional Library (434) 979-7151

Register to Vote- Albemarle county Voter Registration and Elections Department is located at the Albemarle County office Building, 1600 5th Street.

Vehicles:

- Register vehicle/change address with DMV within 30 days of moving to the county.
- Obtain VA Inspection Sticker (if moving from out of state).
- Check with the Albemarle County Finance Department within 60 days of moving to the county, to verify you information on our tax rolls.

Dog Licenses:

- All dogs in Albemarle County Must have a dog license after their first rabies shot. The license must be displayed on the dog collar at all times. In order to obtain a dog license, you will need to bring the rabies certificate from the veterinarian indication the expiration date. This form must be brought each year to purchase a license. You may purchase dog licenses at the Albemarle county office Building, 401 McIntire Road.

Public Safety:

- The Albemarle County Police Department protects and promotes community safety, ensures the safe and orderly movement of traffic, and seeks solutions to any problems that create fear or threaten the quality of life in the county. The department's present authorized strength 125 sworn offices, 25 civilian employees and 4 animal control officers. www.albemarle.org/police
- Emergency communications Center (ECC) receives and processes all emergency and non-emergency calls in the County of Albemarle, the City of Charlottesville and the University of Virginia www.albemarle.org/ecc
